As we reflect on 2024, I am filled with gratitude for the incredible progress we have made in our mission to provide access to justice for those in need. CLS has grown tremendously over the last five years and this past year has been no different. Because of your support and commitment to CLS ensuring all Floridians have access to counsel, our organization, message, and mission are strong. In addition to the nearly 10,000 requests for legal assistance that helped over 8500 families, I am honored to share some of our key milestones from last year that furthered our mission of Legal Access For All.

Of most significance, we implemented strategies to create long-term financial sustainability. In fact, we took a historic step by launching an endowment to secure the future of our organization. This fund will support our mission, allowing us to expand our reach and impact for future generations. I am pleased to announce the fund is already over \$1,000,000 and growing.

We have also sought to increase our already strong public support. To further strengthen our organization as we gain more and more reach within and outside of our twelve counties, we have established an Advisory Council. The Council brings together distinguished leaders from legal, business, and philanthropic communities. Their expertise, guidance, and influence will be invaluable as we continue to work towards our goal of Legal Access for All.

Expanding our outreach efforts, we launched our new television production, Law Talk. This program, in partnership with WFTV, raises public awareness on potential legal issues, provides the public with resources, and helps to bridge the gap between legal complexities and challenges people face every day. Through this initiative, we empower individuals with knowledge to navigate the legal system more effectively.

Finally, in our effort to make lawmakers more aware of how we help constituents and why legal access is an essential part of good governance, we hosted the first annual Legal Aid Day at the Capitol in Tallahassee. This event welcomed all the legal aid organizations across the state to educate policymakers on the critical role of legal services in our communities. This event marked a new line of engagement and visibility for our cause.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the unwavering support of our donors, partners, and dedicated team. As we look ahead, we remain steadfast in our commitment to ensuring legal access for all. Thank you for being part of this journey—we look forward to another year of progress and know that together, CLS is, and can remain, a PILLAR in our community.

ABOUT CLS

Community Legal Services Legal Access For All

Community Legal Services (CLS) is a not-for-profit organization that provides civil legal assistance to qualified individuals within a 12-county area around Central Florida.

More than one million individuals are eligible for our services. Our attorneys and advocates assist nearly 10,000 people in the region each year. Our legal aid organization offers professional legal services aimed at helping vulnerable populations safeguard their livelihoods, health, and families. We strive to facilitate access to legal information, provide legal assistance and representation, and help the most vulnerable and disenfranchised residents of Central Florida understand their rights.

Primarily funded through federal, state, and local government grants and appropriations, and private funders, we assist in noncriminal legal areas.

The 2022 LSC Justice Gap Report indicates that

92%

of low-income individuals do not receive sufficient legal assistance for their civil legal matters.

OUR PROGRAMS



Children's Rights & Special Education — Advocate for students to increase services, reduce suspensions and expulsions, protect the rights of those with disabilities, and combat discriminatory practices for disability, race, and gender.



Community Economic Development — Assist nonprofits and small businesses across the State of Florida in their community development activities by assisting with formation, governance, and various business activities.



Consumer — Protect consumers' rights and ensure they are being treated fairly and justly in their financial transactions and interactions with businesses.



Disaster Recovery — Assist survivors of disasters with legal issues that were caused or impacted by the disaster and identifying other available resources to help them recover.



Fair Housing — Combat housing discrimination based on federal, state, and local laws related to housing sales, rentals, advertising, lending, construction, and insurance underwriting on the basis of all the protected classes.



Family — Prioritize assistance to survivors of domestic violence to promote family stability including injunctions for protections and additional family cases to address long-term family needs.



Helpline — Answer client calls and guide them through various legal issues by providing holistic advice and brief services.



Housing — Focus on renters' rights, reverse mortgage foreclosure prevention, and other housing-related issues with the goal of preserving the client's right to remain in their home safely.



Housing and Consumer Counseling — Provide education, tools, and guidance to reach the goals of each individual and help them identify obstacles, credit improvement, savings, and sustainability by changing behaviors.



Medical Legal Partnership — Provide legal counsel that assists in removing barriers to good health, health care access (through Medical Legal Partnerships), and other basic needs such as housing, income, and safety.



Older Adults — Assist seniors and relative caregivers with matters that impact their healthcare, housing, safety, and independence.



Public Benefits — Help to secure and maintain benefits that create stability for medical, income, and food assistance.



Pro Bono — Expand our capacity to serve our clients and community through our dedicated pro bono attorneys who assist with matters that support our firm's mission across all of our priorities.



Real Property Rights Protection — Preserve housing by transferring/clearing title to real property and enhance generational wealth.











CLS Secures \$20,000 for Couple Misled by Fake Contractor



Lisa and Mark hired a handyman for repairs on their home. What they didn't know was the handyman they had hired was using a stolen contractor's license, leaving their home in disarray after failing inspection. Unsure of how to move forward, they sought legal help from Community Legal Services. Through strategic notices, demands, and mediation, a \$20,000 settlement was secured and wired directly to their account. With the funds in hand, they were finally able to hire a legitimate contractor and take back control of their home.

From Eviction to Stability: CLS Assists With Disability Claims

After suffering a stroke that left her unable to continue working, Mary came to CLS after she received an eviction notice. Together, we were able to apply for SSA disability, which was denied at first, but then benefits were granted during the reconsideration of the application.

Thanks to the help of CLS, Mary is receiving a monthly payment from SSA and has stable housing again.



LEGAL AID DAY 2024



Community Legal Services was honored to work with the Florida Civil Legal Aid Association (FCLAA) in organizing Legal Aid Day at the Capitol in Tallahassee on January 15, 2024. Throughout the day, legal aids from across the state tabled in the Capitol rotunda and hosted a reception to raise awareness about their work providing no-cost civil legal services to Floridians across the state.

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Members of Community Legal Services (CLS) Board of Directors serve as ambassadors educating the community and building relationships that support our mission. Fiduciary duties include financial and program oversight, and broad policy-making.

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LEGAL SERVICES CORPORATION

LSC is the single largest funder of civil legal aid for low-income Americans in the nation. Established in 1974, LSC operates as an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation that promotes equal access to justice and provides grants for high-quality civil legal assistance to low-income Americans. LSC distributes more than 90 percent of its total funding to 132 independent nonprofit legal aid programs with more than 800 offices. LSC-funded programs help people who live in households with annual incomes at or below 125% of the federal poverty guidelines.



FUNDING FLORIDA LEGAL AID

FFLA is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to increase access to the justice system for people of limited means by funding legal services, developing innovative tools and programs, and supporting legal aid providers and the courts. Through strategic grantmaking, FFLA funds local and statewide civil legal aid organizations and projects to improve the administration of justice and increase the effectiveness and efficiency of the legal aid delivery system. FFLA engages in catalytic philanthropy by investing in training, technology, technical assistance, assessment and capacity-building for legal aid and works to develop and expand innovative pro bono initiatives.
